

LOCATION

The Education Centre is located on Stag Hill, just below and to the north west of the Cathedral

DIRECTIONS

The Education Centre can be accessed by car from the A3 (signed for Cathedral and University) or from Guildford Town Centre via Guildford Park Road, Madrid Road and The Chase.

There is no a public bus route that goes right up to the Cathedral; however, there are several routes that stop at the bottom of Stag Hill, leaving a 5 minute up-hill walk to the Education Centre.

Routes 3, 27 and 37 go through the University, the pedestrian route to the Cathedral from the University is well sign-posted from campus. Routes 4 (to Guildford Bus Station past the Railway Station) & 5 (from the Bus Station past the Railway Station) go along Madrid Road to the bottom of Cathedral approach.

PARKING

Parking available free of charge adjacent to the Education Centre.

LUNCH

You are welcome to bring a packed lunch, tea and coffee will be available. There are relatively few facilities in the immediate locality. The Cathedral has a refectory but you would need to call to check opening (01483 560471).
