The Lowther material at SAS Guildford

The purpose of this examination was to prepare a list of Lowther material stored in four boxestat Guildford and which had not been catalogued into the general records of the Society. Alan Gillies, assembling material for an Ashtead History had prepared an outline summary of the records on the basis of a "Lowther" index (not made by Lowther himself) A copy of this summary is also attached. It has not been possible to reconcile all the material with that

Trems 1 - 28 on that list-maps & plans, and 401 & 402, have been incorporated into the library. Items 301 - 307, photocopies of original documents etc are understood to be in the Muniment Room. The whereabouts of items 157-163 are being established.

This new list covers items 101 - 156.Not all are accounted for, but there are many items without reference numbers which may nevertheless be related to the missing items.

Nov 1990 Mrs White Mr Gillies Ashtead Archives Mr Stuttard A W G Lowther was Secretary of the Surrey Archaeological Society from 1947 to 1958 when he was made Vice-President; and was President of the LDLHS at the time of his death in 1972. His records were deposited at the SAS library in Guildford. These and other of his published articles were extensively drawn on when "Ashtead - a Village Transformed" was in preparation. This commentry relates only to those records not amalgamated into the general SAS records.

Lowther's early work with the LOLHS was principally concerned with excavations, In the records just examined were two boxes of "small finds". These have been passed to the Museum who have been able to match them up with earlier reports.

Apart from this work Lowther's main output was a series of articles in the Ashtead Resident entitled"Ashtead and its History". These covered the period from Roman times to the coming of the Railways-see chapters I to XIX. Fuller details on Page 6 of the list.

Many of these articles, but not all, were reproduced in the LDLHS Proceedings between 1949 and 1960. For convenience the titles and dates of publications are listed separately. If it were thought desirable some of the articles not copied to the Proceedings could even now be published but it would be necessary to compare the detail of similar articles closely.

In addition to this series Lowther may perhaps have been working on a History of Ashtead also, for there are several files with this title. Perhaps they were merely the basis for his main series. "File No 6" for example may have been used in chapter V and in an article on Henry Newdigate-Proceedings III-10-28.

In any event the records relate predominantly to the MnNor of Ashtead over the centuries and to the Howard family in particular. There is so much raw material that it must be doubtful if it has all been published. Of aprticular interest are :-

a the slip index of Howard accounts 1691-1722.Of the many subjects covered few seem to have been published b copies of files in the muniment room(101-109) regarding the Howard accounts. It seems that the slip index was made principally, if not wholly, from these files.

For convenience the main articles by Lowther are listed below. This is not a list of everything he wrote but merely a guide to assist in comparing published material with the records.

NB. These journals contain the articles in the series "Ashtead and its History", some of which are reported elsewhere as having been published subsequently in the LDLHS Proceedings. Between issue No 14, Feb 1949 and No 32 Mar 1954 the articles appeared consecutively -thus fromChapter I to Chapter XVII. Issue 49 of Mar 59 contains XVIII; and Issue 51 of Sep 59 contains XIX. In addition the 21st Anniverary issue of Dec 66 contains a reprint of the chapter dealing with the Lawrence map; and No 59 of Sep 61 contains an article on Ashtead Schools with material about the history of Ashtead Park. It is not stated as being written by Lowther but it might have been based on some of his articles.



BUTTRISS ARCHIVE OF MATERIAL ON ALEXANDER RABY

In 1964 George Buttriss, an economic historian at Brooklands College, Weybridge, started to collect information about Alexander Raby with a view to writing his biography. In the late 18th and early 19th centuries Raby was an ironmaster at Downside Mill, Cobham, Surrey, at Coxes Lock Mill, Addlestone, Surrey, at Llanelli in South Wales and elsewhere. Unfortunately George Buttriss was unable to complete this project and shortly before he died in 1990 asked his wife to transfer the material to David Barker, Alan Crocker and Jeremy Hodgkinson on the understanding that it be lodged in an appropriate library for reference purposes and that all users should acknowledge George Buttriss as the source of the information. As the Buttriss Archive it has in practice been deposited in the Research Collections of the Surrey Archaeological Society at Castle Arch, Guildford.

Together with John Potter and David Taylor, the three recipients held discusions about the possibility of completing George Buttriss's biography of Raby but concluded that they were unable to undertake this task. However the idea of holding a one-day conference was attractive and resulted in a meeting held at Cobham on 28 November 1998. The *Proceedings* of this meeting were edited by Glenys Crocker and published under the title *Alexander Raby*, *Ironmaster* (Surrey Industrial History Group, Guildford, 2000).

It has been found convenient to deposit the Buttriss Archive in 12 folders, which are listed in alphabetic order below:

- Boulton & Watt: Photocopies and transcripts of letters from Raby to Boulton & Watt dated 1795 (1) and 1798 (5) and from Boulton & Watt to Raby dated 1798 (3). They concern the sale of pigs of iron and the purchase of a steam engine.
- Cobham & Weybridge: Photocopies of deeds concerning Coxes Lock Mill (1783, 1807, 1906); transcript of a sale notice of Downside Mill (1809); Raby letter of 1798 concerning Coxes Lock Mill; account of Raby being held-up by a highwayman on Hounslow Heath; 20 photographs of Downside Mill in about 1966; research notes on the two mills; profit & loss account of Coxes Lock Mill for 1881-1887; invitation to Raby from Duke of York to dine at Oatlands; etc.
- 3. Correspondence 1964-89: About 190 letters, either written by Buttriss to institutions and individuals seeking information about Raby or the responses he received.
- Draft Chapters and Notes: Various handwritten or typed draft chapters for the intended biography of Raby, including sections headed, Introduction, General Economics, Family Origins, The Rabys in London, Warren, Surrey, Raby in Cobham, Coxes Lock, Raby and the Wedgwoods, Movement to South Wales etc. Also many sheets of handwritten notes and analyses of data.
- 5. Drapers Company: Photocopy of apprenticeship indenture (both parts) of Edward Raby, 1693, and other apprenticeship records relevant to the intended biography.

- Economic History of Weybridge: Two sets of papers, each bound by Buttriss at the top left-hand corner. The first is entitled "Research on Economic History of Weybridge" and the second "Alexander Raby: The Lost Ironmaster", but this has been crossed through. The accounts are based on Buttriss's early research and some letters dated 1964 are included.
 - 7. Raby Family History: Family trees and photocopies or transcripts of records of births, marriages and deaths; addresses.
 - Raby Family Wills: Photocopies of 31 wills, inventories etc of members of the Raby and other families, dated 1544 to 1835, plus some transcripts and notes.
 - South Wales: Photocopies of documents, dated 1803-26, relating to Raby's activities at Llanelli held in the Neville records deposited at National Library of Wales, and notes on these. Articles and extracts from books on the history of Llanelli and its ironworks and notes on these by Buttriss, etc.
 - Warren Furnace: Photocopies of a patent specification (1771), maps, articles and extracts from books relating to Warren furnace, etc.
 - Weale Manuscripts: Photocopies of 38 pages from the Weale papers at the Science Library, South Kensington, 11 of which are letters concerning Raby, a summary of this material by Buttriss and an A5 booklet entitled "The Buttriss Notes" signed by Alan Denny.
 - 12. Wedgwood: Thirty items, mainly photocopies of letters from or concerning Raby in the Wedgwood Collection in the Library of the University of Keele.
